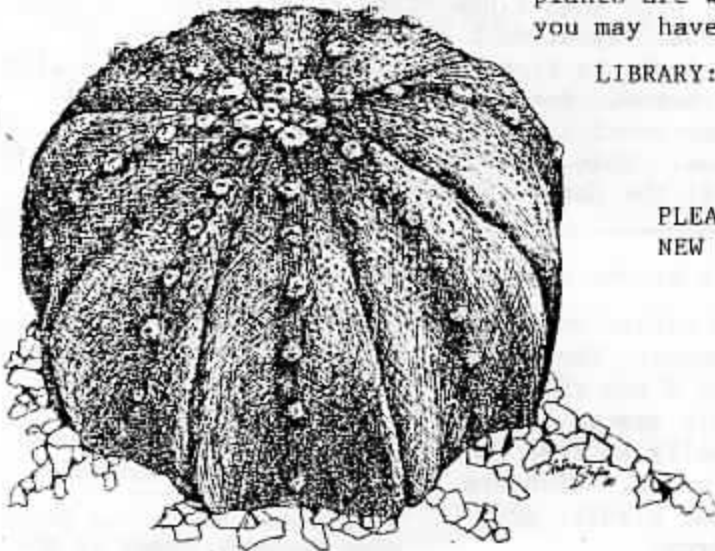
NOVEMBER MEETING: November 9, Sunday, at 1:30 PM.

Also, as regards photos, if I drive fast & am lucky to find the Mita machine free, I will in future be able to duplicate photos. In any event, I don't yet have all the Carpinteria photos.....Bear with me...

Astrophytum asterias is the rarest and most ornamental species in the genus. The hemispherical bodies usually bear 8 low ribs on which occur a few very widely spaced large, white, woolly areoles, usually in rows and completely unarmed. The flowers, which are freely produced even in young plants, are glossy yellow with a red throat.

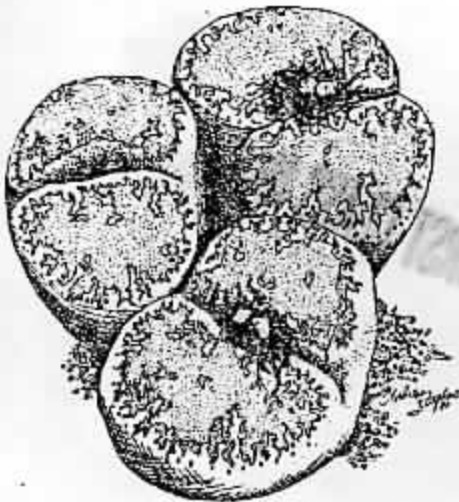
