

#### PLANT OF THE MONTH RULES

- A maximum of three plants may be entered in each category (cactus and succulent).
- Advanced entrants must have had the plant in their possession for at least six monthi, novices for three months.
- Advanced entrants will receive 6 points for first place, 5 points for second place,
   4 points for third place and 2 points for showing a plant that does not place.
- Novice entrants will receive 4 points for first place, 3 points for second place, 2 points for third place and 1 point for showing a plant that does not place.
- At the discretion of the judges there may be up to three third places in-a category. If plants are not deemed to be of sufficient quality, no third place will be awarded.
- For an entrant to receive points, the person in charge of record keeping for POM must collect the entry tags.
- At the annual Christmas party, award plants will be presented to the four highest cumulative point holders in both the advanced and novice classes.



## Cacti and Succulent of the Month

This month, the Cacti and Succulent of the Month are both miniatures. Miniatures are defined differently for different local shows. In most cases, the definition is a mature plant in a pot with an inside diameter less than three inches. Some shows define the miniature category as any plant displayed as a miniature. This allows seedlings and young plants to be entered as miniatures. We'll use the broad definition for the Plant of the Month.

The miniature category is one of the most popular in our shows, with the number of entrants in the category often one of the two or three largest. The key to success in these categories is staging plants. Particular attention must be paid to the relation of the plant to the pot, the top dressing, and any rocks. The importance of color, geometry, and texture are all magnified in the smaller scale of miniatures.

Succulent plant growers are not the only ones entranced by miniatures. Those of you with a web browser can see a wonderful Japanese site devoted to mame (palm size) bonsai at http://www.mmjp.or.jp/mini-bonsai/index.html. Although none of the plants shown on this site are succulent, they show the possibilities of good design with minimal material and size.

Some Cacti suitable miniatures:

Ariocarpus kotschoubeyanus - the classic entry

Blossfeldia - a genus of miniature cacti from Brazil

Epithelantha micromeris a variable species from Texas and Northern Mexico.

Frailea - a genus of mostly small cacti, some of which clump too large for this category.

Mammillaria saboae (discovered by club member Kitty Sabo!) and it's varieties and forms

Pelecyphora asseliformis another classic from Mexio

Turbinicarpus another genus of slow growing, small cacti from Mexico.

Others can be found in several genera, including Mammillaria, Gymnocalycium, Lobivia, Rebutia, etc.

Succulents entered as miniatures include representatives from almost every family, and a list would be far to long. Unusual entries often do best.
