## IT'S SHOW TIME!

This year our Show & Sale Committee Co-chairs are Nancy Jengo and Heidi Husnak. They have worked very hard to ensure the event runs as smoothly as it did under Jim Gardner's steady hand. So let's be extra helpful this year and

understand that things may run a little differently. We didn't give any guidance to members at the March meeting. That was my fault. So I'll try to say it here. We really want all members to come and enjoy themseleves - bring a friend and a camera, as there promises to be many plants worthy of a photo.



Round tables will carry DISPLAYS set up by our vendors snd Society members. They can be either "Specimen" to show individual plants, or "Artistic" to show succulent plants in an artistic way in any medium. We ask visitors (including members) to vote for their favorites. It's just a personal choice.

Members are encouraged to bring up to four plants for the CLUB table (the long one in the center of the hall). The Table Coordinator will give all plants a "health" check and if there are too many of one species, the best or better ones will get the space. You get one mini-show point for each of your plants on the table. Please bring your plants 1:00 - 4:00 PM on Friday. Print legibly on the entry slips. PLEASE pick them up after 4:00 PM Sunday. If you forget or are unable to pick them up, someone will hold them until they can be returned.

#### **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE Contintued:**

If you are volunteering at the show please come early enough so you are ready for the public by 8:30 Saturday morning. REMEMBER . . parking may not be as usual. Plant drop off on Friday probably won't be an issue other than congested, but if you come after mid-morning on the weekend, you may be asked to park at the PV Shopping Center and take a shuttle.

Please sign-in and pick up your name tag at the Hospitality Table and wear it so visitors can identify you as a Society member. A potluck lunch is provided for vendors and Society volunters. We appreciate your wonderful contributions to the lunch.

And finally, even though elections are not until June, we already have our Nominating Committee in place. M.A. Bjarkman and Sally Fasteau have agreed to serve. In the event that they contact you, please give serious thought to their request.

#### **Our Annual Show & Sale Info**

Public event: Saturday April 9 and Sunday April 10, 9 AM to 4 PM both days. Setup starts at 10 AM Friday. Please bring show plants Friday between 1:00 PM and 4:00 PM. Please remove show plants Sunday between 4:00 PM and 5:00 PM. Aprons will be available for sale with the club name and logo for \$15 each. First come first served.

#### Parking

Due to the popular Nature Connects Lego sculpture display on exhibit at the South Coast Botanic Garden through May 8th, parking may be a bit more challenging than usual.

When you arive at the garden please let any garden staff at the entrance know that you are attending the cactus club sale, and let them know if you have items to drop off, or are volunteering at the sale.

#### **Drop off**

Vendors and participants dropping off plants and other large items can drive up to the rear doors of the auditorium and unload as always. Parking after drop-off will probably be inside the garden.

#### Vendors and Volunteers

Those working at the show will probably be able to park inside the Garden. You will be directed past the back of the hall, through the back gate into the Garden, and along the road to the back of the County greenhouses. If you arive before the garden staff are in place please continue past the back of the hall, through the gates, follow the road to the bend then keep right to reach the yard beyond the Greenhouses, please park responsibly.

#### Member/Public Parking

In the front parking lot two rows (either side of an aisle) will be reserved for the public and club members arriving for the Show & Sale. If the reserved area is full, you can park in any open spot in the Garden parking lot. Once the Garden parking lot is full, ALL parking (C&S Society and visitors) will be directed to the overflow parking lot at the Peninsula on the Promenade shopping center (PV Mall). The lot is between Indian Peak Road and Silver Spur located at 550 Deep Valley Drive on levels 2 and 3. A free shuttle service will be provided to and from the Garden.

#### **Plant Pickup**

There will be a drive-up loading zone in the parking lot. The planned location is the bays adjacent to the auditorium. Customers who parked off-site can leave their plants there (under supervision), they will be able to pick them up once they have retrieved their vehicle. Garden staff will be available to provide direction, when you return let them know you are picking up purchases.
