Mike Short will give a short video presentation of his on-line plant database, MOP-DB, that he is inviting members of SCCSS to join.


The database is for us plant collectors, allowing us to keep track of our plants.



There are two plant categories, Cactus and Succulent. Up to three entries per member may be entered in each category.

Exhibitors must be club members in good standing and present at the meeting.

One member's name representing a household must be used unless plants are grown and shown separately. We trust you.

Any container may be used, including plastic. The containers and plants must be free of pests and disease. Only one plant/container is permitted but this includes rosettes/offsets/pups connected by rhizomes, stolens,

and above ground clusters. Dish gardens are an exception if they are the category of the month. Novice and Intermediate entries must be grown by the exhibitor for a minimum of six months, and open class entries for one year.

Usually our speaker (as an unbiased expert) will be asked to judge, but if the speaker is a Society member, one or two members who are not showing will be asked to judge. Remember, judges may not be experts and usually judge based on how well the plant is grown and staged.

The following point system is used.

1st place = 6

2nd place=4

3rd place=2

Entries not disqualified receive 1 point.

After the November meeting, point totals will be reviewed by the Board. Novice and Intermediate members with more than 64 points or with at least 6 first place awards may be asked to move to the Intermediate or Open class if their entries show them qualified. This is a subjective judgment.

Remembering David Verity



David Verity, South Coast Cactus and Succulent Society member, passed away last month shortly after his 90th birthday following a long illness. David was a consummate plantsman and longtime garden manager at the UCLA Mildred E. Mathias Botanical Garden (MEMBG).



David was a native Californian, born in Los Angeles. After military service during the Korean War he enrolled at UCLA and graduated in 1959 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Ornamental Horticulture, supplemented by strong campus curriculum in Botany led by Mildred Mathias. Shortly after graduating he began working as a nurseryman in the UCLA Botanical Garden. This was a garden love that continued for 33 years until his retirement in 1992, most of this time as Garden Curator in charge of the collection.



David made many major contributions to Southern California horticulture in introducing new drought-tolerant plants to cultivation from his own international collections as well as working with Mildred to propagate seeds that she brought back from her travels. In this activity he oversaw a major expansion of the MEMBG plant collection. His careful hybridization work led to many new cultivars that are widely planted in Southern California gardens today, most notably with aloes (examples planted at South Coast Botanic Garden), bush monkeyflowers, iochromas, and pride-of-madeira. This work and his leadership role for many decades with the Southern California Horticultural Society made David a living legend among his colleagues. He was a Dudleya mentor to Kei Nakai, who ended up naming *D. verityi* after David.

His work in horticulture and insects will be treasured.


