It's Past and Present

(Summary of the June 17 program)

The educational program of the Sunday, June 17, meeting of the South Coast Cactus & Succulent Society was led by Laurel Woodley. Laurel has taken over the daunting responsibility for signage of all plants at the South Coast Botanic Gardens, and as a result, has a vast knowledge of the garden and its plants and history.

The program consisted of a brief history of the establishment of the cactus & succulent garden in 1982, including photos of this early garden, which was built on the "rock pile" where rocks had been dumped during the garden's previous life as a land fill. After this brief introduction, Laurel led a walk through the cactus & succulent garden. Several members present had participated in the original planting of the garden. Carol Causey had donated the large Pseudobombax elipticum, which Laurel thinks is the largest one growing in California today. Many of the larger plants were in very good condition, though several of the larger Euphorbias had suffered during the January frost. There have been several incidents of vandalism in the last year, with some of the larger cacti being chopped down during the night. Great progress has been made during the year by volunteers who have removed Lantana, and trimmed back overgrown Opuntias.

The garden is planning to expand the cactus & succulent garden to adjacent areas, which will require the removal of several non-succulent plants.

Laurel's guided tour was enjoyed by all.

There will be two classes of entrants: novice and advanced.


• Intermediate entrants must have had the plant in their possession for at least six months; beginners, for three months.

 There may be up to three third places in a category. If plants are not deemed to be of sufficient quality, no place will be awarded.

Entry tags must be collected by the person in charge of recordkeeping

 At the annual Christmas party, award plants will by presented to the ten highest cumulative point holders, regardless of class.

Dale's father introduced him to his first succulent "Portulaca oleracea" known by a score of more common names. But to Dale it was called pigweed and it grew between the neat rows of corns, beans, and tomatoes in his family's vegetable garden in a large plot in back of his family's home in Grosse Pointe Michigan. Once a week, his father asked Dale to KILL these plants with a hoe. The task so unnerved him that after failing to do well in college, he enlisted in the United States Air Force in 1957 and never touched a hoe or succulent for over 40 years.

During his 26 years in the USAF he was a Radar Technician, a Meteorologist, and finally a Nuclear, Biological and Chemical Warfare Officer before retiring as a Major in 1983 – having "seen –theworld", he and his wife Mary bought a home in Torrance and he settled down (although Mary continues to travel <grin>. Feeling he still had something to contribute at the young age of 48 and a little bored, he went to work for the Los Angeles Red Cross as a Disaster Preparedness expert and retired again in 1998 having participated in the LA Red Cross response to all the major local disasters during that period in several capacities. His other interests include astrophysics and classic jazz. He has over 16,000 mp3 tracks on his computer and enjoys playing his Yamaha PSR 630 keyboard.




