BRAGGING TABLE: Bring what looks good or what's interesting. Quite a few are blooming and some of the summer dormant


plants are waking up. Bring any plants you may have questions about.

Astrophytum asterias is the rarest and most ornamental species in the genus. The hemispherical bodies usually bear 8 low ribs on which occur a few very widely spaced large, white, woollly areoles, usually in rows and completely unarmed. The flowers, which are freely produced even in young plants, are glossy yellow with a red throat.




Lithops bromfieldii
