Attendance: 84 were in attendance.

President Maria Capaldo called the meeting to order at 1:35 p.m. in Frances Young Hall. She welcomed all and wished everyone a Happy New Year, then thanked those who helped set up for the meeting. She reminded everyone to add their names in the watering can for the free plant drawing. She told us there is one more free membership to CSSA available for a drawing and those interested should sign up now or during the break with Sally Fasteau. The drawing will occur during the break. She then asked Jade Neely to introduce the speaker.

Program: Jade introduced speaker Marcia Tatroe, a speaker from Colorado and a contributor to Sunset Magazine. We were told to ask questions during the presentation, entitled “Rockin’ with Cacti and Succulents,” rather than at the end. Marcia began by thanking Gary Duke and Jade for their guided tour of the area while she’s visiting.

Marcia talked about moving to Colorado and noticed there was no communication between different Botanical Societies. An exchange began between CSS and the Rock Garden Society and combinations of rock gardens with more succulents and cacti became more desirable. Her images were full of different styles of rock formations and plant mixes in large and small gardens, even rock gardens without rocks. She stated that the thing that defines rock gardeners is they “like to collect plants,” displaying a lot of singles in their gardens. She covered hardscaping, climate, plant examples and talked about using nonorganic mulches.

When the talk was over, Maria reminded us that Mike Short e-mailed a copy of the talk on January 3rd to Club members.

Announcements before the break:

Jade Neely announced that the February program will be a speaker originally from Palos Verdes, Greg Krehel. His presentation is called “Freaky Flowers: Echinopsis Flowers in Bloom” and shows these plants in timelapse sequences. A sample can be found on the Club website.

Kitty Guzman will draw names for free plants. Art Guzman and Bernard Johnson will judge the Mini-show.

Heidi Husnak said the Show and Sale will be held on Saturday, April 7 and Sunday, April 8. There will be a sign up for volunteers. Visitors to the Garden doubles to 700 per day during the Show and Sale. Set up starts on Friday and break down will be on Sunday.

Anita Caplan, Publicity Coordinator, announced that she has hundreds of printed post cards to advertise April’s Show and Sale. See her during the break with requests for the number of cards you would like to give out and Anita will provide them at next month’s meeting.

The President recessed the meeting at 2:50 p.m. for refreshments, plant sales, and the rest of the Mini-show judging.

After the Break: The President reconvened the meeting at 3:10 p.m. Art Guzman announced the Mini-show winners, aided by Bob Lewis. This month's plants were Cactus: *Mammillaria* - Hooked Spines and Succulent: *Caudiciform*.

Maria thanked the judges (Art, Bernard and Bob) and asked them to each pick a free plant for their assistance. She thanked Rose Arbuckle for helping in the kitchen in Carol Causey's absence and asked members to sign up and bring in food for February's meeting. Marilyn Rubin's recipe for a kale salad she served at the Holiday Party is available.

Maria showed images of her *Fockea edulis* in flower and passed around the fluffy seed samples.

New members, and guests: Sally Fasteau introduced last month's new member, Sherwin Rubin. Sally then introduced this month's new members: Joan Dennison, Rosalie Gorchoff and Rick Hernandez.

Birth month plants: Members with December and January birthdays chose their free plants.

Door prize plants: Kitty Guzman drew names for Bernard Johnson to announce the winners of the remaining free plants.

Maria announced that the plants of the year are not available today for those who were not at the Holiday Party. Please measure your plants, record growing conditions, repotting dates and locations. Place all your information on the provided forms for next year.

Minutes approval: The minutes of the November General Meeting, previously distributed, were approved.
