Program:

M.A. Bjarkman introduced our speaker Jeff Moore, of Solana Suculents near Del Mar, who talked about his new book "Dudleyas" that he co-authored with Kelly Griffin and Jeremy Spath. Dudleyas are found from the Southern Oregon coast to the Baja coast and some inland areas. They are used to living in harsh environments, in some cases on rocky slopes, and do not need much tending in gardens. Of the few species that are in cultivation, Jeff recommends starting with *D. brittonii*, *D. pachyphytum* and *D. virens* ssp. *hassei*.

A question and answer period followed his talk, which concluded at 2:30pm.
