- Where did you grow your plant? (Greenhouse, window sill, patio/balcony)
- Did the plant survive until Nov 2018? (Y / N)
- Did you like the plant? (Y / N) o If so, why did you like it or did not like it?
- Did the plant flower in your possession? (Y / N)
- Was it grown in full sun, partial sun or shade?
- Did you repot it? (Y / N)
- If repotted, when and what soil mix was used?
- What was the approximate watering schedule?
- Did you fertilize? With what kind of fertilizer, how much and about how often?
