some great photos of the meeting on our Facebook page.



SCCSS Show & Sale Volunteer Jobs

Dear Society Members: This is a general list of job descriptions for the upcoming Show & Sale, April 23-24. Please read this over to find a job you would like to do. We would like to spend some time at the upcoming meetings getting volunteers assigned to the various jobs. FRIDAY SETUP

Arrive Friday, April 22nd at 1:00 PM to help arrange the tables, put up signs. General helping of show organizing.

SOCIETY SALE TABLE: These are plants society members have donated. The table needs to be set up with tablecloths and plant tags by Friday afternoon. (All are provided by the society.) Members can bring in their plants starting Friday afternoon. Saturday morning help arrange the plants on the table and make sure they are pest free. On Saturday and Sunday, keep an eye on the plants, answer general questions about the plants and keep table looking nice

CASHIERS

Check out buyers by ringing up the cost on the tags, adding up the total with tax and collecting cash and checks. Experience with a cash register advised. Credit card person will run the cards and give receipts.

TAG PULLERS

We need many people to help pull tags in different shifts. Tags are in the plants the buyers are purchasing. Pullers need to pull the tags, count them and make sure that number matches the number of plants to be purchased.

HOSPITALITY/MEMBERSHIP/ T-SHIRTS

Volunteers will help with new memberships or sell T-shirts Answer general questions and direct guests to features of the event.

PRESALE PLANT HOLDING AREA

These volunteers will help watch that buyers only take their plants and not pick and choose from other people's plants in the holding area. Can be a sitting job.

OUTDOOR HOLDING PLANTS

Hold plants for those who need to drive their car up to parking lot to load plants in their car. Sign up for shifts.


CLEAN UP

SOUTH COAST CACTUS AND SUCCULENT SOCIETY CELEBRATES NATURE'S ARTISTIC MASTERPIECES AT GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY SHOW AND SALE.

First Ever Event At Palos Verdes Art Center Features Thousands Of Eye-Catching Plants, Artisan Hand-Crafted Pottery And Expert Growers Offering Free Advice.

After a frustrating two-year absence, the always-popular annual Show and Sale of the SCCS Society, first begun in 1972, is back to wow the public once again in person. And the timing could not be better.

You'll find inspiration at the Show contributed by the Society's expert gardeners whose homegrown succulents will be on glorious display in containers that enhance the plants' qualities.

This year's sale, the weekend of April 23-24, will offer literally thousands of plants including rare, unique, hard-to-find specimens from both the Society's members and well-known vendors. Popular standards and favorites will also be available at reasonable prices. You can get advice and the answers to your questions from these same plant aficionados.

Everything the gardener needs to express their creativity and successfully grow all of these succulents can be found at the sale, including tools, supplies, fertilizers, labels, top dressing and a wide variety of hand-made pots and containers.

When this Society was started 50 years ago, it could not be imagined how relevant and widespread succulents would become. The immense popularity of drought-tolerant cactus and succulents, many in aesthetically-appealing, creative designs and combinations, can now be seen in landscapes across every neighborhood in Southern California where they are well suited to our low water trends.

Although not carefree, they require little maintenance in the right conditions. Perhaps more than any plant type, succulents provide a sculptural element to gardens and are often chosen for their form, color or shape. Their range of colors, alluring shapes, textures, flowers and forms spur their use to paint and sculpt your garden. The only limits are your imagination.

Artistic expression in your garden can take many forms, whether in a single focal plant or mass use of one or more types ... or in containers that can be artfully arranged. You can showcase a single subject in a container that perfectly frames its beauty or you can create a garden that incorporates plants that may provide flowers throughout the year.

Whether succulents are arranged in a pot or one specimen is showcased, it is often the container that enhances the statement they make. Laurel Woodley, who has held positions in the national Cactus and Succulent Society of America and of the local Society, has a garden that demonstrates the dramatic impact that a succulent in a thoughtfully-chosen container can have.

"Succulents provide an opportunity to diversify or add new interest to your garden with water-wise plants," Laurel enthused. "Placing multiple plants together creates a pallet or appealing look, whether in a container or in the ground. It takes an artistic eye to combine plants, and it can take trial and error.

Some principles I've learned include staging potted plants to look as natural as possible. In nature, they may grow amongst rocks which can add to a garden design. You don't have to rely on their beautiful flowers for color. Some succulent leaves provide more intense color at certain times of the year, such as *Aloe dorothea*."

SCCSS president, Maria Capaldo, expressed that, "We are happy to plan in-person meetings back at the South Coast Botanic Garden this year starting in June. We'll resume our usual programs which include fascinating presentations from speakers on topics ranging from propagation to planting to the travels they've undertaken to experience cacti and succulents from around the world. Members bring plants to display, vendors sell their plants, knowledge is shared, problems are addressed and expertise is freely given during typical monthly meetings. That is the purpose of our Society and it's even more successful now that ever."

As the premiere venue for local art and artists, the Palos Verdes Art Center is an apt home for this year's show and sale. The spacious and inviting Art Center is bathed in bright, natural light from its distinctive overhead dome, displaying plants in their glory.

No reservations are needed for free access to the Show and Sale as well as the Center's galleries and gift shop. Ample, free parking and a convenient access ramp is provided.

The SCCSS is a non-profit society founded in 1972. For 50 years they have promoted education and cooperation among hobbyists and others interested in the study, culture and propagation of succulent plants, including cacti that adapt well to our region in particular, but also educate us about those around the globe.

Mini-Show Rules

Exhibitors must be club members and must be present at the meeting in order to receive points. One name representing the same household must be used unless plants are grown separately. Mini-show coordinator will be consulted if there is any question of entry identity.

Any container may be used, including plastic, as long as it is clean. All plants must be groomed and free of pests and disease.

There are two plant categories, "Cactus" and "Succulents". Up to three plants per individual may be entered in each category.

There are three entry classes: "Novice", "Intermediate" and "Open". Only members new to the hobby would be expected to be in the novice class. After the November meeting, members' point totals will be reviewed by the Board of the Society. Novice members awarded more than 64 points or winning at least 6 first place awards will be asked to move to the Intermediate class in both categories. Intermediate Members awarded more than 64 points or winning at least 6 first place awards, will be asked to begin showing in the Open class.

All plants must be grown by the exhibitor for a minimum of six months for novice and intermediate and one year for open class. An individual plant may be entered only once a year

Scoring:

First Place: 6 points

Second place: 4 points

Third place: 2 points

Placement: all entries that are not disqualified receive one point
